## News release: For immediate release

### ***An Important Message from Platte County Public Health and Emergency Management regarding COVID19 in Platte County:***

***Platte County is currently in the orange: Moderate-High transmission levels, WITH***

***Red Zone: high transmission Levels, for cases per 100,000 population AND***

***Yellow Zone: Moderate Transmission Levels, for test positivity rate***

As of 7/27/2021, Platte County has 14 COVID related deaths, 24 active positive cases, 465 cases per 100,000, and 7.2% positivity rate.

The CDC and Wyoming Department of Health (WDH) recommends fully vaccinated individuals wear masks in public indoor settings for counties in the **yellow, orange, or red** zones according to WDH metrics. These metrics are found online on the WDH COVID 19 information page.

If you haven't yet been vaccinated, then wearing a face covering and social distancing is still very important until you have been fully immunized. Don't miss out on your opportunity to get the COVID vaccine!

**Remember:** Cold or allergy-like symptoms could be COVID, as well as fever, fatigue, muscle aches, chills, lost sense of taste and/or smell, and headaches. If you have these symptoms, ***even if you have been vaccinated***, please call your provider to be tested.

**Please note:** Quarantining after exposure to known or suspected COVID disease is still the requirement to protect others, as well as isolation of positive COVID-19 cases. Fully vaccinated individuals do not need to quarantine if exposed to COVID-19 but the CDC recommends testing at day 3-5 after exposure and wearing masks in public indoor settings until receiving a negative test result or for 14 days after exposure without testing. Fully vaccinated individuals with a positive test result will be required to isolate. We are still doing contact tracing for quarantine and isolation cases.
